More than four million people in Canada are living with a disability, representing a significant percentage of the electorate. When these citizens go to the polls on October 19, it is vital that they do so having had a full and equal opportunity to meet their candidates, consider their options and make informed choices. Indeed, this is their right as Canadians.

Throughout the campaign period, all-candidate debates, forums and other events will be held in ridings across the country. As these events are scheduled, accessibility must be a central consideration for organizers and participating candidates and parties.

As the leader of the Bloc Québécois, we are strongly urging your party, your candidates and you, personally, to ensure people with disabilities have equal access to any and all national and local debates, forums and campaign events. Chosen venues cannot present any barriers to their attendance and active participation. A failure to provide access constitutes an infringement of their guaranteed Charter rights.
